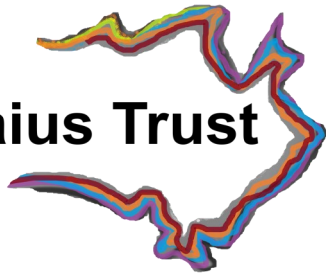

A chain of small towns stretches into outback New South Wales: Gulargambone, Warren, Quambone, Coonamble, Pilliga, Walgett, Brewarrina, Lightning Ridge, Bourke, Weilmoringle, Goodooga and Collarenebri [100-200 km apart].

The Fuel Fund has been established to help Koori (Aboriginal) pastors with travel; these brothers are often covering large areas, ministering the Gospel in several localities; frequently called upon to comfort the dying, support the bereaved and bury the dead with Christian dignity. They walk with those in the valley of the shadow of death and isolation. There have been conversions in Brewarrina and Walgett prompting a prayerful move northward to disciple and witness regularly where people appear accessible and in some sense roused.

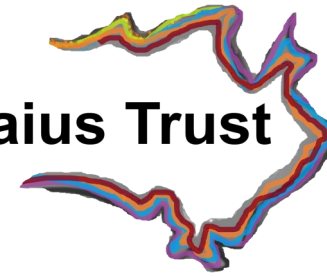
